What is Legal Aid?

If you need legal help but can't afford it, we might be able to help.

We have lawyers who can help if you have been charged with a crime or need help with a family matter.

Can I get Legal Aid?

- I do not have enough money to pay for a lawyer.
- I have been charged with a crime or I need help with a family matter.
- A lawyer agrees I need legal help.

We look at your income and will decide if you can get Legal Aid. If you get social or band assistance, or if you are low income, you may be able to get Legal Aid.

I need help with a criminal matter.

- I am in police custody.

The Brydges phone line is free. You will get legal advice from a lawyer. The police will help you call this line.

- I am in jail.

A lawyer can help you at a bail hearing for free. This is called Duty Counsel Service.

- I have been charged with a crime.

A lawyer might be able to help you if you do not have enough money to pay for one.

I need help with a family matter.

- I need help with child custody.
- I need help with child or spousal support.
- I need help with divorce or separation.
- I need help with another family matter.

A lawyer might be able to help if you do not have enough money to pay for one.

I am a youth (12 to 17).

- I can get Legal Aid.
