GLADUE SUBMISSION

A Gladue submission is a story about your life. It includes details about:

- □ your family and friends
- □ your community
- □ your support workers
- □ your Gladue factors
- □ what you are good at
- □ your goals
- □ your plan for healing
- □ your plan for support

A Gladue submission helps the judge understand how you got to be in the court.

A Gladue submission can be written or spoken by you, your lawyer, a court worker or a support person.

Your lawyer or a support person can help you with your Gladue submission.

GLADUE AND YOU

YOUR RIGHTS AS AN INDIGENOUS PERSON



If you are ...

□ an Indigenous, Inuit or Métis person
□ about to be sentenced in court or have asked for bail

... then Gladue applies to you.

You can be Status or non-Status.

You can live on or off reserve.

WHAT IS GLADUE?

Gladue is a legal right all Indigenous people have in court anytime you are before a judge.

Gladue means a judge has to ...

□ look at your background and your life as an Indigenous person

□ look at Indigenous healing and wellness to help you

... before you are sentenced or given bail.

The details about your life are called your Gladue factors.

GLADUE FACTORS

Your Gladue factors may include:

☐ time spent at a residential or day school

□ racism

□ foster care

□ time spent in jail

□ poverty

□ disabilities

Your Gladue factors are written into a Gladue report or a Gladue submission.
